# Leaving Our Mark

This year, the United Way of Ellis County was able to leave their mark and help a lot of people. For the holiday season United Way worked with a local organization Can You See Me? to help with a Shop with a Cop event, bringing gifts and necessity items to families in need. The United of Way of Ellis County also received 350 toys this Christmas from the Good360 and Toys for Tots with assistance from the United Way of the Plains, some of which went to the Shop with a Cop families.

These gifts were also distributed to United Way partner agencies to be given to families in need. Toys were destined for KVC Hospital, Big Brothers Big Sisters and Salvation Army's Angel Tree project. We wanted everyone to have a good Christmas, especially when so many were struggling with COVID-19.















United Way was also able to partner with the Schmidt Foundation to distribute free meals this holiday season. These meals were distributed from the Press and Thirsty's by all our amazing volunteers. Thanks to them, 962 meals were distributed to anyone who had registered.

We want to give a special shout out to the EMS workers, our young mission group, as well as everyone else that took the time to help give people a free meal for Christmas. We could not have helped as many people as we did without their help. Thank you for making a positive change within the community!

United Way of Ellis County was also able to bring RealityU back to schools, despite COVID-19. Students from TMP, Hays High and Hays middle school spent some time learning about financial responsibilities and planning for the future. They get to choose careers and other life choices to get a glimpse of the real world and how to be better prepared when it comes to making real life decisions.

This event was put on thanks to the Pando Initiative, business sponsors, and our amazing volunteers. We could not have done any of these without their help.







This year, COVID-19 resulted in a worldwide shut down. However, in these times, the Wonder Woman League continued to work in their community to help those who were in need. In April of 2020, the Wonder Woman League made masks and button headbands for workers at Hays Med. Using the donated materials, the group worked to create cloth face masks for the 600 plus workers that worked tirelessly through this difficult time. The WWL ended up making 670 masks, 359 headbands with buttons, and 265 button bands to provide comfort for the masks. Additionally, these amazing women made another 98 masks to be included in the Matthew's gift bags for

traveling families. Another 158 masks were made in appreciation for yearly sponsors, as they continued to show support through the pandemic. In total, this group of women made 926 masks for the community.

Not only was the Wonder Woman League busy making masks, they were also occupied with other projects such as putting together self-soothing boxes. Before, the pandemic, there has been an increase in anxiety seen in children, and after COVID-19, it has only gotten worse. Each box was filled with items that engage the senses and helps effectively manage anxiety. Some of these items



included scented silly putty, bubbles, stress ball, fidget spinner, mini puzzle cube, small hand lotion, pinwheel, Play-Doh, chewing gum, suckers, peppermints, bubble wrap, journal and colored pencils. The boxes will also include inserts about stress and useful websites to visit and other information about mental health. A total of one-hundred-eight boxes were put together and will be split between High Plains Mental Health, Turning Point Mental Health Clinic and Serenity Psychological Services.

Another project was distributing gift bags to residents of the Ascension Living Via-Christi Village and the Good Samaritan Society. Each resident received their own gift bag containing a bag of PoPt popcorn, a hand cream, lip balm, eyeglass cleaning cloth, and snack size bag of assorted mints. In addition to their gift bag, they were able to choose an item or two from a tote containing body wash, emery boards, soft fuzzy socks, chocolates, puzzles, adult coloring books, colored pencils, word search books and facial tissue. Staff at the long-term care

facilities were treated to Daylight Donuts and bags of PoPt popcorn in appreciation of their service.

It is thanks to these incredible women that positive change can be brought to the community. We thank not only the dedicated members, but also the amazing volunteers that help too. They do so much for Ellis County and deserve all the recognition as they continue to create a better community and help those in need that may slip through the cracks. Thank you.


